The Vigil

The Greeting

The Archbishop introduces the vigil in these or similar words

Brothers and sisters in Christ, from earliest times, Christian people have gathered through the night before Easter to recall the wonderful history of their salvation from the creation of the world to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. This Easter Liturgy is not only a recalling of past events - it is an experience of new life and new beginning for us all. So let us pray that through this Easter celebration God may bring to perfection the saving work he has begun in each of us.

Please remain seated

Collect

Almighty God,
who wonderfully created us in your own image,
and yet more wonderfully restored us through your Son Jesus Christ;
grant that, as he came to share in our humanity,
so we may share in the life of his divinity;
who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

Reading: Genesis 1-2.4a, *Six Days of Creation and the Sabbath*

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

And God said, 'Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters.' So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome. And it was so. God called the dome Sky. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day.

And God said, 'Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear.' And it was so. God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, 'Let the earth put forth vegetation: plants yielding seed, and fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it.' And it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the third day.

And God said, 'Let there be lights in the dome of the sky to separate the day from the night; and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years, and let them be lights in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth.' And it was so. God made the two great lights – the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night – and the stars. God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth, to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

And God said, 'Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky.' So God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm, and every winged bird of every kind. And God saw that it was good. God blessed them, saying, 'Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth.' And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day.

And God said, 'Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind.' And it was so. God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good.

Then God said, 'Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth.' So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. God blessed them, and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth.' God said, 'See, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food. And to every beast of the earth, and to every bird of the air, and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food.' And it was so. God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all their multitude. And on the seventh day God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all the work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he had done in creation. These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created.

Psalm 33: 1-11 *sung by the choir*

Rejoice in the Lord, O ye righteous:

for it becometh well the just to be thankful.

Praise the Lord with harp:

sing praises unto him with the lute, and instrument of ten strings.

Sing unto the Lord a new song:

sing praises lustily unto him with a good courage.

For the word of the Lord is true:

and all his works are faithful.

He loveth righteousness and judgement:

the earth is full of the goodness of the Lord.

By the word of the Lord were the heavens made:

and all the hosts of them by the breath of his mouth.

He gathereth the waters of the sea together, as it were upon an heap:

and layeth up the deep, as in a treasure-house.

Let all the earth fear the Lord:

stand in awe of him, all ye that dwell in the world.

For he spake, and it was done:

he commanded, and it stood fast.

The Lord bringeth the counsel of the heathen to nought:

and maketh the devices of the people to be of none effect,

and casteth out the counsels of princes.

The counsel of the Lord shall endure for ever:

and the thoughts of his heart from generation to generation.

Collect

Almighty God,

you have created the heavens and the earth

and made us in your own image:

teach us to discern your hand in all your works

and your likeness in all your children;

through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. **Amen.**

Reading: Exodus 14: 1 - 31, *God saves Israel from the hand of the Egyptians*

The Lord said to Moses, 'Why do you cry out to me? Tell the Israelites to go forward. But you lift up your staff, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it, that the Israelites may go into the sea on dry ground. Then I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they will go in after them; and so I will gain glory for myself over Pharaoh and all his army, his chariots, and his chariot drivers. And the Egyptians shall know that I am the Lord, when I have gained glory for myself over Pharaoh, his chariots, and his chariot drivers.' The angel of God who was going before the Israelite army moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud moved from in front of them and took its place behind them. It came between the army of Egypt and the army of Israel.

And so the cloud was there with the darkness, and it lit up the night; one did not come near the other all night. Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea. The Lord drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night, and turned the sea into dry land; and the waters were divided. The Israelites went into the sea on dry ground, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. The Egyptians pursued, and went into the sea after them, all of Pharaoh's horses, chariots, and chariot drivers. At the morning watch the Lord in the pillar of fire and cloud looked down upon the Egyptian army, and threw the Egyptian army into panic. He clogged their chariot wheels so that they turned with difficulty. The Egyptians said, 'Let us flee from the Israelites, for the Lord is fighting for them against Egypt.' Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Stretch out your hand over the sea, so that the water may come back upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots and chariot drivers.' So Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and at dawn the sea returned to its normal depth. As the Egyptians fled before it, the Lord tossed the Egyptians into the sea. The waters returned and covered the chariots and the chariot drivers, the entire army of Pharaoh that had followed them into the sea; not one of them remained. But the Israelites walked on dry ground through the sea, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. Thus the Lord saved Israel that day from the Egyptians; and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore. Israel saw the great work that the Lord did against the Egyptians. So the people feared the Lord and believed in the Lord and in his servant Moses.

Psalm 114 *sung by the choir*

When Israel came out of Egypt:

and the house of Jacob from among the strange people,

Judah was his sanctuary:

and Israel his dominion.

The sea saw that, and fled:

Jordan was driven back.

The mountains skipped like rams:

and the little hills like young sheep.

What aileth thee, O thou sea, that thou fleddest:

and thou Jordan, that thou wast driven back?

Ye mountains, that ye skipped like rams:

and ye little hills like young sheep?

Tremble, thou earth, at the presence of the Lord:

at the presence of the God of Jacob;

who turned the hard rock into a standing water:

and the flint-stone into a springing well.

Collect

Lord God our redeemer, you heard the cry of your people, and sent your servant Moses to lead them out of slavery; free us from the tyranny of sin and death, and, by the leading of your Spirit, bring us to our promised land; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Reading: Isaiah 55: 1 – 11, *Come to the water all you who thirst*

Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labour for that which does not satisfy? Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food. Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live. I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David. See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples. See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you, because of the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you. Seek the Lord while he may be found, call upon him while he is near; let the wicked forsake their way, and the unrighteous their thoughts; let them return to the Lord, that he may have mercy on them, and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts. For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it.

Psalm 42: 1-7 *sung by the choir*

Like as the hart desireth the water-brooks:

so longeth my soul after thee, O God.

My soul is athirst for God, yea, even for the living God:

when shall I come to appear before the presence of God?

My tears have been my meat day and night:

while they daily say unto me, Where is now thy God?

Now when I think thereupon, I pour out my heart by myself:

for I went with the multitude, and brought them forth into the house of God;

In the voice of praise and thanksgiving:

among such as keep holy-day.

Why art thou so full of heaviness, O my soul:

and why art thou so disquieted within me?

Put thy trust in God:

for I will yet give him thanks for the help of his countenance.

Collect

Let us pray for peace and justice throughout our world. Blessed are you, Lord, God of our salvation. You quench the thirst of those who yearn for righteousness and satisfy the hunger of those who crave for justice. Lead your longing people back to peace, that with the mountains and hills we may burst into songs of joy, O Lord, our maker and redeemer. **Amen.**

The Ceremony of Light

The Pascal fire is lit at the West End of the Cathedral

The Archbishop, holding the Paschal candle, says:

Eternal God,
who made this most holy night to shine
with the brightness of your one true light:
set us aflame with the fire of your love,
and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

The Archbishop blesses the Paschal candle, saying

Christ yesterday and today
the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega,
all time belongs to him, and all ages;
to him be glory and power, through every age and forever. **Amen.**

The Archbishop fixes the incense grains in the Paschal candle and says

By his holy and glorious wounds
may Christ our Lord guard and keep us. Amen.

The Archbishop lights the Paschal candle from the Paschal fire, saying

May the light of Christ rising in glory,
banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

The Deacon holds the candle high and sings

The light of Christ
Thanks be to God.

The choir followed by the clergy and congregation, enter the cathedral to await the arrival of the Paschal candle, when the acclamation is repeated:

The light of Christ
Thanks be to God.

The other candles are lit. (Please take care of the flame and of the hot wax.)

The Paschal candle is carried to the screen and the acclamation is sung:

The light of Christ
Thanks be to God.

The Paschal candle is placed in its stand and the great Easter hymn is sung:

Exsultet

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels!
 O Universe, dance around God's throne!
 Jesus Christ, our King, is risen!
 Sound the victorious trumpet of salvation!
 Rejoice, O earth, in glory, revealing the splendour of your creation,
 radiant in the brightness of your triumphant King!
 Christ has conquered! Now his life and glory fill you!
 Darkness vanishes for ever!
 Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory!
 The risen Saviour, our Lord of life, shines upon you!!
 Let all God's people sing and shout for joy.

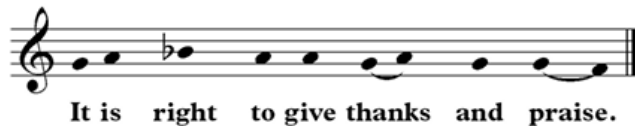

The Archbishop says

Alleluia! Christ is risen.

The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!

The cathedral is now fully illuminated, the cathedral bells are rung, the organ sounds forth and Gloria in excelsis is sung by the choir. The candles of the congregation are extinguished

Proclaiming and Receiving God's Word

The Epistle:

Romans 6: 3-11

A reading from the letter to the Romans:

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God**

Easter Anthems *sung by the choir*

Christ our passover has been sacrificed for us:

so let us celebrate the feast,

not with the old leaven of corruption and wickedness:

but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

Christ once raised from the dead dies no more:

death has no more dominion over him.

In dying he died to sin once for all:

in living he lives to God.

See yourselves therefore as dead to sin:

and alive to God in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Christ has been raised from the dead:

the first fruits of those who sleep.

For as by man came death:

by man has come also the resurrection of the dead;

for as in Adam all die:

even so in Christ shall all be made alive.

Luke 24: 1-12

Hear the gospel of our Saviour Christ according to St Luke:

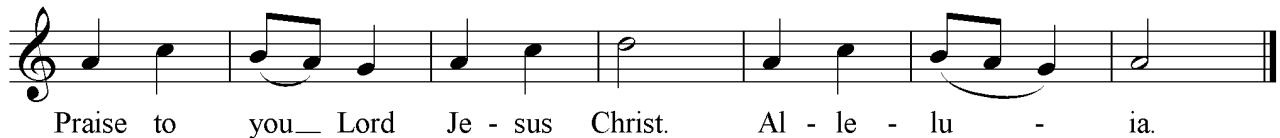


Please turn to face the reader

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again.' Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.

The Renewal of Baptismal Vows

The Archbishop uses these or similar words

God raised Jesus Christ from the dead, and sent the Holy Spirit to recall the whole world to himself. In baptism we die to sin and rise to newness of life in Christ. Here we find rebirth in the spirit, and set our minds on his heavenly gifts. As children of God, we are continually created anew, as we walk the path of faith, and feed on the forgiveness of his healing grace.

The Archbishop addresses the candidate for baptism

But first I must ask, do you wish to be baptised?

Yes

Are you ready with your own mouth and from your own heart to affirm your faith in Jesus Christ?

I am

The Decision

The Archbishop addresses the candidate and congregation:

In baptism, God calls us from darkness to his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all proud rebellion against God?

I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the Way, the Truth and the Life?

I come to Christ.

The Archbishop says to the congregation

You have heard our sister respond to Christ. Will you support her in this calling?

We will support him.

Prayer over the Water

The Archbishop blesses the water for baptism, praying:

We thank you, almighty God,
for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.
Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.
Through water you led the children of Israel
from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land.
In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John
and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ,
to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism.
In it we are buried with Christ in his death.
By it we share in his resurrection.
Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.
Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son,
we baptize into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit,
she may be cleansed from sin and born again.
Renewed in your image, may she walk by the light of faith
and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord;
to whom with you and the Holy Spirit
be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Archbishop addresses the congregation.

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess, together the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Son?

**I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord
who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit,
born of the Virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again;
he ascended into heaven,
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,
and he will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit?

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen**

The Archbishop addresses the candidate.

Rimako, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The candidate is anointed with oil.

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross.
Live as a disciple of Christ, fight the good fight, finish the race, keep the faith.
Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection,
look for his coming in glory.
May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,
restore in you the image of his glory,
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. Amen.

Rimako, God has called you into his Church.

The congregation joins the presiding minister, saying

**We therefore receive and welcome you
as a member with us of the body of Christ,
as a child of the one heavenly Father,
and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God.**

While the Archbishop sprinkles the people with holy water, the choir sings:

Vidi aquam egredientem de templo, a latere dextro, Alleluia:
I beheld water which proceeded out of the temple, on the right side thereof, Alleluia:
Et omnes ad quos pervenit aqua ista, salvi facti sunt,
and all they to whom that water came were healed every one:
Et dicent: Alleluia, Alleluia.
and they say Alleluia.

Confitemini Domino, quoniam bonus, quoniam in saeculum misericordia ejus.
O give thanks unto the Lord for he is gracious: and his mercy endureth for ever.

Gloria Patri, et Filio, et Spiritui Sancto,
Glory be to the Father and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost;
Sicut erat in principio, et nunc, et semper, et in saecula saeculorum. Amen.
As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

The Confirmation

The Archbishop says to the candidate and congregation

Our help is in the name of the Lord
who made heaven and earth.

Blessed be the name of the Lord
now, and for ever. Amen.

Almighty and everliving God,
whose Son Jesus Christ was crucified and rose again
to break the power of sin and death:

We give you thanks and praise for the gift of your Holy Spirit
by whom your servants have been born again
and made your children.

Grant that in the power of the same Holy Spirit
they may continue to grow in the knowledge and likeness of Christ;
Increase in them your gracious gifts,
the spirit of wisdom and understanding;
the spirit of right judgment and inward strength;
the spirit of knowledge and godly living,
and fill them, O Lord, with the spirit of reverence for you.

The candidates to be confirmed kneels before the Archbishop who lays a hand upon them saying.

Rimako, God has called you by name and made you his own.

Confirm, O Lord your servant Rimako with your heavenly grace, that she may
continue to be yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and
more until she comes to your eternal kingdom.

The candidate responds

Amen.

Heavenly Father,
we pray for your servants upon whom we have now laid our hands,
after the example of the Apostles,
to assure them by this sign of your favour towards them.

May your fatherly hand be ever over them.

Let your Holy Spirit ever be with them.

Lead them to know and obey your word, and keep them in eternal life;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Archbishop says to the candidate and congregation

Those who are baptised are called to worship and serve God.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship,
in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you persevere in resisting evil,
and, whenever you fall into sin,
repent and return to the Lord?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you proclaim by word and example
the good news of God in Christ?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you seek and serve Christ in all people,
loving your neighbour as yourself?

With the help of God, I will.

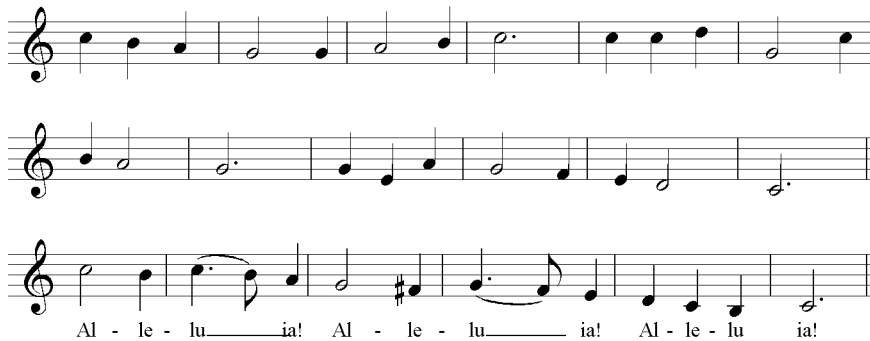



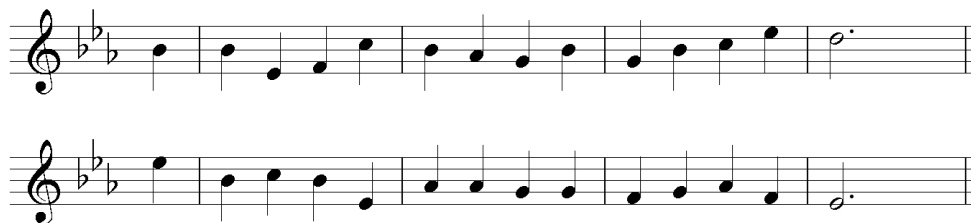
