- We aim to follow and champion good sustainability practices, reduce the environmental impacts of our activities, and give something back to the environment.

Our Sustainability Policy

We will uphold sustainability practices by:

- Ensuring we comply with all relevant environmental regulations and legislation.
- Reducing our consumption of resources including energy, water, and other raw materials, and ensuring the efficient use of the resources we do consume.
- Ensuring consideration is given to the environmental, social, and ethical impacts of the goods and services we buy.
- Working with our suppliers to reduce the impact of our supply chain and to encourage them to improve their substantial and environmental practices.

- Managing waste generated from our organisation in line with the waste hierarchy; by avoiding waste in the first place, then giving priority to minimising, reusing, recycling, recovery of waste, and finally ensuring the safe disposal of waste.
- Regularly reviewing our practices with the aim of continually improving the impact of our activities on the environment, local community, and wider society.
- Measuring and taking action to reduce the greenhouse gas emissions associated with our activities. Christ Church Cathedral is participating in the Failte Ireland Climate Action Programme.
- Supporting social and environmental projects and initiatives within our community and in wider society.

Christ Church Cathedral commits to communicating this policy to staff and interested stakeholders (suppliers, event managers etc).

This policy will be reviewed regularly to evaluate its continued relevance and to monitor our progress.
